John 14:1-14

If you were writing the story of you own life, do you think you would try to come across as humble, and down play your accomplishments?

Do you grant that some readers of the Gospels could find Jesus to be prideful? Does it sound haughty to say: "I am the only way to God"?

In our day, many accuse Christianity of being "exclusive"; that is, of declaring that no other religion or god can save. How would you respond to them?

As you read the questions and doubts of Thomas and Philip in this passage, does it seem like the disciples should have understood more quickly?

Jesus said in verse 12 that when he went to the Father, the disciples would do even greater works that he had done. Does the Bible teach that this really happened? Explain:

Do you think that same prophecy applies to believers today? Are we also capable of greater things than Jesus did?

What things should we ask for in the name of Jesus (see vs. 13-14)?
