Here are 10 compelling reasons:

- 1. **Most inmates are very discouraged**. They and their family need to hear the Good News and Hope that only comes from God's Word. Rom.10:15 (we also offer children's lessons through the Mailbox Club to help reach the whole family which is our goal).
- 2. In prison, they have **plenty of time to study God's Word**. Eph.5:16
- 3. Many are **looking for purpose and meaning to life** (Living for Christ gives an eternal purpose) Ephesians 3:9-13
- 4. Prison has **fewer worldly distractions** (No cell phones, no internet, etc.)
- 5. All inmates **need to be loved** (The Word of God tells the truth of the ultimate source of love) 1 John 4:8
- 6. Prison gives them **time to reflect** on the bad choices they have made and many are looking to change. Acts 26:17-18
- 7. All inmates **suffer from loneliness** (many have very few visitors, a visit from PMA, brings hope, correspondence instructor letters are like Christmas)
- 8. **Many have reached a point of humbleness, brokenness and a contrite heart-** rock bottom so to speak. They are ready to listen to God and His will for their life. Psalm 51:17
- 9. **Many have a hunger to study God's Word**. Psalm 63:1. 68-87% of inmates sign up for PMA Bible studies at prison transitional fairs!
- 10. Most have realized they are sinners and cannot save themselves (In contrast to many outside think they are good people and don't need God) Rom.3:23 Many inmates acknowledge that coming to prison was "the best thing that ever happened to me" because they encountered Christ.

What is the Biblical basis for prison ministry?

<u>PRINCIPLE 1: REDEMPTION</u> - All things are redeemable through Christ. He can bring spiritual healing and new life!

Crime is fundamentally a moral problem. It is a result of man's rebellion against God. It is secondarily a socioeconomic problem. The solution is in the person of Jesus Christ.

Rom. 3:23-24; 6:23 Colossians 1:13-14 Ps. 107:1-2,8-16 God sets us free from the bondage and prison of sin!

<u>PRINCIPLE 2: SERVICE</u> - The Body of Christ is called to minister to those who are imprisoned or oppressed.

Unlike any other organization or ministry, the Church has been ordained to be God's instrument of grace and ministry in this world. The act of serving prisoners, ex-prisoners, and their families in the name of Jesus is both a ministry and a means of worship and spiritual growth.

2 Corinthians 5:20 - We are therefore Christ's ambassadors, as though God were making his appeal through us. We implore you on Christ's behalf: Be reconciled to God.

God needs an ambassador to your local jail and prison. Who will go? He has chosen us to be his ambassadors, to be his mouthpiece and given us the ministry of reconciliation.

Hebrews 13:3 - Continue to remember those in prison as if you were together with them in prison, and those who are mistreated as if you yourselves were suffering.

Matthew 25:40-43

<u>PRINCIPLE 3: TRANSFORMATION</u> - By our faith, we bring glory to God on earth and communities are transformed.

Prison ministry is a powerful testimony to the world of the transforming power of the love of Christ. The community as a whole experiences transformation as the Church reaches out to all those affected by crime and demonstrates the mercy and grace of Jesus.

Ephesians 4:14-16; 22-24

God's ordained way of ministry is the local church. We are to plant seeds to grow more churches. It is our goal to plant churches behind bars through our PMA Bible courses.

We want to thank God and give him all the glory and praise for what He is doing to transform lives behind bars. As we establish graduates of our program, it is **our goal to plant churches behind bars**, helping inmates reach inmates for Christ. They can be distributing and correcting lessons in each of their facilities. These churches would be like house churches and develop leadership and ministry skills to build the Body of Christ.
