## **Inwardly Jewish**

## Romans 2:17-29

When humankind sinned and God offered a solution to restore fellowship, he chose to use a 'people' with whom he made a covenant. Those people were the Jews; Paul, the author of Romans, was one of them.

Some of Paul's readers were (and are yet to this day) Jews. In this passage he confronts their feelings of superiority, stemming from obedience.

Observe his challenges to them:

Do you struggle with feeling superior to others?

Do you struggle with others who (in your judgment) feel superior to you?

Does religious observance make a person better than one who is not?

Read Romans 2:29, and pray about how in your life, the Holy Spirit needs to "circumcise your heart"
