The Big Contrast Colossians 2:16-3:17

The brief letter to the church in Colossae is about the person of Jesus and his supremacy in everything. Chapters 1 and 2 are more centered on truth, while chapters 3 and 4 emphasize life application. Today's passage is the final part of ch. 2 and the first half of ch. 3, so serves as a bridge.
