Series: This is My Story - Ruth

To date, our stories in this series have been well known heroes of the faith:
Noah, Abraham, Joseph, Moses, Joshua, Gideon, Samson In what way is Ruth a departure from that list?
1 Peter 3:15 instructs believers to be ready to give an for the hope we have; as you read the book of Ruth, how would she have learned about hope?
Starting with the covenant in Genesis 12, God promises Israel; how does that reconcile with the famines we've seen in the stories of Abraham, Jacob, and Elimelek?
In the Bible, we find characters whose names were changed: Abram > Jacob >
Simon > Saul > Naomi asks to have her name changed, in Ruth 1:20-21 How does that contrast with the changed names above?
Reflection: Read Lamentations 3:33, and ponder Naomi's conclusion: "the Lord has afflicted me" Do you need to alter a similar false narrative in your own life?
Do you feel hopeful? Are you ready to answer someone who asks you why?
How can you use story-telling to bless others who need Jesus?
